

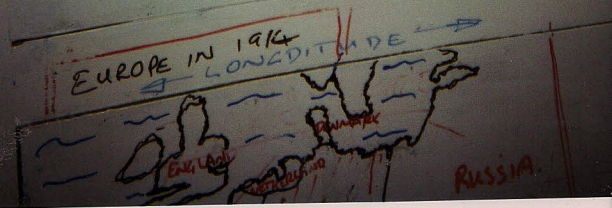



(Written about 1850)

about a weaver

- a lonely weaver

- an man held in suspicion  
by his neighbour

about human relations in an <sup>English</sup> village  
at the time of the Industrial Revolution. JH-MAYBE

"Crime and Punishment" - Fyodor Dostoevsky.

(Written in 1866)

Great physical + psychological tension.  
- about a murderer and society in  
St Petersburg.

- also wild humour.  
- a man alone in his thoughts.  
JH-MAYBE

"The Alchemist" - Paulo Coelho (1988)

• Boy Shepherd who travels  
meets a girl he likes.  
Being poor + young, before he can settle down  
- he meets adventure, seeking some wealth.  
JH = "NO"

"The Holy Man" - Susan Troff (1995)  
- a book of short stories of human  
characteristics seeking answers. JH = "NO"
